

The socio-economics of Atlantic mackerel bait use in the Nova Scotia lobster and snow crab fisheries

The Fishermen and Scientists Research Society (FSRS) invites you to participate in a project focused on the use of Atlantic mackerel as bait within the lobster and snow crab fisheries. The study is aimed at collecting information that will help inform fisheries management personnel on the factors that influence bait type within the lobster and snow crab fisheries, and how much Atlantic mackerel is used as bait within those fisheries. This project is supported by WWF-Canada.

For this project we are asking people who use Atlantic mackerel as bait in their lobster or snow crab fishing practices to participate in a small focus group that will answer questions focusing on five main topics: What are you using for bait? Why do you choose that species for bait? Where are you getting it from? How much do you use? What are you concerns about bait in the lobster and snow crab fisheries?




Figure 1 Focus Group Study Area

Focus Group Geographical Distribution:

This project will be covering the Eastern shore of Nova Scotia, as well as LFA 26a along the North shore (Figure 1). Areas are shown in red circles.

Focus Group Size: Approximately 3-6 participants in each focus group.

Focus Group Locations: Focus groups will be held at community halls and/or other places of convenience for participants.

Focus Groups Dates/Times: Dates and times for the focus groups will be set based on participants availability (e.g. slow periods in fishing seasons or following other meetings or events).
